


Spanish Bridging Work

The Spanish Language

Before moving on to studying Spanish in the Sixth Form in September, ensure that your knowledge of GCSE grammar is secure. To this purpose, **please complete the attached grammar exercises and bring the answers with you on your first week of the new term.** Additionally, to keep your Spanish language skills sharp, we recommend that you do at least one of the suggestions below.

- **Practise your grammar and tenses** by completing exercises on www.languagesonline.org.uk , www.oyelanguageskills.co.uk , www.ver-taal.com or any other Spanish language learning website. (There are many).
- **Find a Spanish song** that you like, study the words and learn and practise pronunciation through singing it. We recommend artists such as La Oreja de Van Gogh, Juanes o Rosalía.
- **Read the news** about the Spanish speaking world on www.bbcmundo.com . Visit the site regularly to decipher the headlines and read the first lines of any articles you find interesting.
- **Watch/listen the Spanish news** in 10 minutes on YouTube channel <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=xR-4NDFsYNk> or in this website <https://www.newsinslowspanish.com/>

You could also start to familiarise yourself with Spain and Latin America by doing any of the following:



- Find out about a **festival** that is celebrated in the Hispanic world: its origins, evolution, typical food and costumes, etc. Suggestions are La Tomatina, Las Fallas de Valencia, La Feria de Abril, La Semana Santa de Sevilla, etc
- Research a Hispanic **dance**: flamenco, sevillana, tango, sardana, salsa, etc- its origins, music, instruments, costume, etc
- Read a novel set in Spain. George Orwell (**Homage to Catalonia**) and Laurie Lee both wrote of their experiences in the Spanish Civil War or read **The Shadow of the Wind** by Carlos Ruiz Zafón.

- If you are interested in Art, research a Hispanic **artist** (Picasso, Dalí, Miró, Gaudí, Frida Kahlo) or read Picasso's War by Russell Martin about the painting of '**Guernica**'.
